Our parish has six major areas of ministry:


- ✓ Outreach

- ✓ Parish Life


Our expenditures include wages and benefits, diocesan maintenance, property costs, etc., but rather than thinking of these as expenditures, we think of them as *investments in ministry*.

When you give to St. Swithin's Parish, your donations affect in a positive way, the lives and hopes of others through one or more areas of these ministries.

Using a spreadsheet, we've carefully allocated all of our "investments" to our six areas of ministry, and calculated our planned ministry investments for 2005.

Here are our investments in ministry expressed as pie charts . . .





PARISH LIFE

John 10:10 "I have come that they may have life and have it abundantly".

Parish Life accounts for approximately 12% of our annual dollar investment in ministries or approximately \$28,000 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

This investment provides for: Coffee hour after the Sunday service Hospitality after events Parish events such as our monthly community dinners Garage Sales and other community-building/fundraising events The parish newsletter Publicity about our services and activities Follow-ups and visits to newcomers Provision of attractive grounds, lighting and signage The ministry of Greeters and Sidespersons Staff for hospitality and special events Administration of tickets, posters, schedules

Our vision for the future includes:

- more social activities to bring parishioners together
- an expanded new member ministry

PASTORAL CARE

1 Peter 5:2 "Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers – not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be".

Pastoral Care accounts for 12% of our annual dollar investment in ministries or approximately \$28,000 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

This investment provides for:

Visits to the sick, infirm and bereaved by clergy and lay visitors in hospital, retirement homes or at home Pastoral counseling by our priest Regular Holy Communion for sick and shut-in members at home Spiritual help and guidance Phone calls to parishioners and others in need Lunches and social events Maintenance of an up-to-date parish list Coordination of Prayers of the People requests The Residential Schools Settlement Fund

With more funds and time available, we could: -Set up opportunities and groups to establish deeper friendships, and to learn and experience more about God

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Matthew 9:35 "Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness".

Christian Education accounts for 14% of our annual dollar investment in ministries, or about \$32,500 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

This investment provides for: Support and training for children's ministry Quality educational materials Update of Church School curriculum and supplies Decoration of church school areas Maintenance, repair and cleaning of Church School areas Planning and conducting special children's events such as the Christmas Pageant and Sunday School Picnic Baptism, marriage and confirmation preparation Adult education events and courses Guest speakers at forums from time to time Spiritual advice and counseling by our priest Administrative support for all these activities

With more funds and volunteers available we could offer prayer, exploration, training and development for people in need of spiritual nourishment, refreshment and guidance.

OUTREACH

Matthew 25:40 "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me".

Our Outreach Ministry accounts for 35% of our total annual dollar investment in ministries, or about \$78,000 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

This investment provides for: Direct help for those less fortunate in the community Meeting our diocesan allotment for outreach Support for the work of our Church in the community, the diocese, across Canada and around the world Meeting space for a variety of community groups Maintenance of meeting rooms and security Local outreach projects such as ______ Developing parish brochures and welcome packets Welcoming new members and families and encouraging their involvement Opportunities for youth activities Maintaining our informative web site Administrative support for all these activities

WORSHIP & MUSIC

Psalm 100:2 Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs".

Worship & Music accounts for 15% of our annual dollar investment in ministries, or about \$34,000 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

This investment provides for: Maintenance, repair and cleaning of our main church, offices, sacristy and choir room Vestments, linens, Eucharistic elements and other worship supplies for the weekly Sunday Eucharist Production of bulletins and orders of service Salaries for our Organist, and sexton New music Organ maintenance and repair Flowers and decorations in and around the church Adequate time for the preparation of meaningful sermons and children's talks Supply clergy when our priests are absent Special services at Christmas, Easter and Holv Week. Thanksgiving. Choral Evensongs, and other special occasions Guest preachers on occasion Baptisms, weddings, funerals and the Sunday Eucharist Administrative support for all these activities

EVANGELISM

Matthew 28:19 "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit".

Evangelism accounts for 12% of our annual dollar investment in ministries or approximately \$27,000 plus countless clergy and volunteer hours.

Understanding ourselves as ministers of the Gospel by virtue of our Christian baptism

Talking about our faith often and comfortably

Encouraging parishes, clergy, and laity to respond to the challenge of evangelism


Administrative support for all these activities

PARISH INCOME

The following chart shows a breakdown of our actual receipts and budgeted receipts in 2004.



Many Anglicans give their time and talent in abundance. But when it comes to escalating heating costs, offering adequate incomes for clergy, and supporting a multitude of ministries, their gifts of treasure often fall short of parish needs. Our General Giving, Rental Income, and Miscellaneous Income had to be supplemented by approximately \$22,500 from our Investment Fund in 2004.

Our average annual gift per envelope was \$923; considerable higher than the Diocesan average annual gift of \$750. It is estimated that Anglicans in Niagara give on average about 1.5% or \$1.50 for every \$100.00 of income. In our parish it is also about 1.5%. We can and should do better!

Generous givers experience the spiritual benefits of generosity in their own lives - a deepened trust in God, a reordering of personal priorities and the experience of God's abundance providing for their own needs.

PROPORTIONAL GIVING

So how much is enough? We ask you to please consider giving at least 2% of your income or an amount equivalent to 1 hour's pay per week.


Some parishioners give 3%, 5%, or more of their income. If you are working toward the goal of giving 10%, please consider increasing your current pledge by an additional one or two percent.


ENVELOPE GIVING AND PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENTS (PAP)

Note in the following chart that Envelope giving has remained all but constant in the past 2 years. It is our hope that the number of regular givers will continue to grow along with the number of parishioners who give through Pre-Authorized Payments (PAP). Currently there are only 22 PAP givers.

PLANNED GIVING

HAVE YOU MADE A PLANNED GIFT? For most of their lives Anglicans give regularly from their income and cash flow through weekly offerings and special appeals. We know that what we give through the church is a gift back to the Creator who is the source of life for each of us.

We also have a Christian responsibility to be good stewards of our assets. A Planned Gift is a way of contributing to the mission and ministry of the church from your accumulated assets. It is a deferred gift – you decide now how you would like your assets to be used later.

The simplest form of Planned Giving is to *remember the Church in your will* e.g. St. Swithin's Parish, the Diocese of Niagara, the Primate's World Relief and Development Fund, etc.

There are other ways to plan your response to God's generosity in your life. Some Planned Gifts may provide tax benefits today, others can give you a guaranteed income for life, and some enable you to give a significant future gift at a modest present cost. Decisions on these matters are a very personal and important part of your financial planning.

As a good steward you will want to make sure any gift is well protected, well managed, and used for things you support. Endowment and Trust funds are ways of meeting these goals.
